

From Fr. Jesse Burish



Praised be Jesus Christ!

As a priest in a parish, I've observed and come to appreciate the differences between men and women and how each have unique gifts and abilities that serve well Christ and his Church. These are generalizations that don't fit everyone perfectly, of course, but I've found that in many projects and initiatives in the parish, many men tend to be very

practical and good at looking at the big picture. Many women are good at paying attention to details.

When we think of our families and family relationships, women, particularly as mothers tend to exhibit a special thoughtfulness and sensitivity. They are particularly conscientious about the needs of all the members of the family. Of course, the distinct role of men and fathers is just as vital, but these are some of the qualities that women often bring to the table in families and in other aspects of life.

Perhaps with this in mind, God, in his mysterious designs, has given a special place to Mary, the mother of his Son as our mother and special guide in our journey to union with God in this life and the next. Therefore, on this fourth and final Sunday of Advent before Christmas, the Church draws our attention to Mary in the Gospel. This Sunday's Gospel is the scene of what we call the Visitation. The angel Gabriel has just appeared to Mary. In a spirit of profound trust and obedience to God's will, Mary had just said "yes" to conceiving Jesus, the son of God, in her womb.

I'm sure she was overwhelmed, not only by the startling appearance of this supernatural messenger from God, but also by what was just asked of her. But what is important for us to notice is that Mary wastes no time at all to visit her cousin Elizabeth, whom she was told by the angel was pregnant as well. Elizabeth was a lot older, and pregnancy would certainly be difficult. It's clear here that Mary's primary concern here was not so much for herself, but for her cousin, who would now need some help.

The angel Gabriel never commanded Mary to go help Elizabeth. He seemingly didn't even suggest it. But Mary had the conscientious desire to help. Mary was attentive to seeing a need, and immediately responded by wanting to help. We see this same attentiveness of Mary in other parts of the Scriptures as well. Jesus and his disciples and his mother Mary were present for a wedding celebration in the town of Cana. At the party, neither the wine steward, nor the newlywed couple, nor the mother of the bride recognized that they had run out of wine. Only Mary did. Because she has a special love, she notices the details and does what is possible to help. And this is what she was doing from the time she was young and said yes to God.

As we are just a couple days away from Christmas, I think it is especially appropriate to look to Mary, our spiritual mother whom God has appointed over us to help us with the best preparation possible to receive the Lord at Christmas. While many people are inclined to say that Mary is just a distraction in our life of faith, that we should just "go to the source," Jesus and the whole Church are saying to us, "Actually, my mother is the best person to help you along your way."

Mary, whether we are fully conscious of it or not, is concerned about us and about all these things in our lives because she is primarily concerned with our relationship with her Son. She is the perfect mother who is concerned about the details of our life. She is thoughtful and wants to help us. She wants us to come to her, to ask her help and guidance and to invite her in. This is the special role that God has given her to demonstrate motherly concern for our souls.

Do you for any reason find this time of year overwhelming? Are you weighed down by serious and real anxieties or concerns? Do you humbly acknowledge that your relationship with the Lord is not quite what it could or should be? What is the obstacle you face or the concerns that weigh on you? Entrust this to Mary (pray to her daily, speak to her, ask her) who as a perfect mother wants to help with the details. And she will help prepare you in the best way for the coming of the Lord.

Mass Schedule Change Updates

When changes were made to the weekend Mass schedule at the beginning of *September*, it was indicated that we would take the next few months to discern any final changes following the reopening of Holy Ghost Church after the renovation. After careful consideration, we've decided to make the following minor changes:

- Beginning the Sunday after Christmas, Dec. 29, the 8am Mass at Holy Ghost will shift to 7:30am, and the 9:30am Mass at St. Bridget will shift to 9:15am. The 11am Mass at Holy Ghost will remain the same. The Saturday vigil Mass at Holy Ghost will remain discontinued.
- Additionally, starting Friday, Dec. 27, all Friday morning Masses at Holy Ghost will be at 8am.

We listen, empathize, and stand alongside them as they navigate life's challenges.
