# St. Francesca of Rome

Feast Day: March 9 (1384 – 1440)

Francesca was born in the city of Rome in 1384 to a wealthy, noble family. She wanted to become a nun but was forced to marry. Although the marriage had been arranged, it was a happy one, lasting for forty years. Francesca visited the poor and took care of the sick, inspiring other wealthy women of the city to do the same. During a time of flood and famine, she turned part of the family's country estate into a hospital and distributed food and clothing to the poor. According to one account, her father-in-law was so angry that he took away from her the keys to the supply rooms; but gave them back when he saw that the corn bin and wine barrel were replenished after Francesca finished praying. She founded the Olivetan Oblates of Mary in 1421, a religious order for widowed women that cared for the poor and sick. St. Francesca was canonized by Pope Paul V on May 9, 1608.

# From Fr. Jesse Burish

Praised be Jesus Christ!

The purpose of Lent is to keep alive for us the fact that being a Christian disciple really means constantly striving to become a Christian ever anew; of growing in one's discipleship of Christ. It's not a "one and done," but a process of constant practice.

On the second Sunday of Lent, while each year coming from a different Gospel writer, we

always hear an account of the Transfiguration of Jesus on Mount Tabor. Throughout the Scriptures, mountains are always special symbolic places of encounter with God. I'd like to propose that the Transfiguration on Mount Tabor represents for us the mountain of worship, and particularly the regular worship of the Mass. My reflection on this Sunday's Gospel is to help us ask, "How am I being called to become a Christian anew this Lent through my regular worship in the Mass?" How am I letting the Mass transform my Christian life? Peter, James and John, the three apostles privileged to be there, had a startling experience as Jesus' face and clothes changed and Moses and Elijah flanked him. Then came the voice of the Father, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to Him." Those words of the Father are the heart of this moment. This experience will enter the deep memory of the apostles and will sustain them in the difficult times ahead because these same apostles will be with Jesus in the garden of Gethsemane. Here on Mount Tabor, they had an experience of Christ's glory that would sustain them through the passion and death of Jesus. They were told to listen to the words of Jesus about his own suffering and passage into glory because that will be their journey as well. They will know the suffering in their own life and this experience on the mountain will give them an assurance of glory.

Again, for us, Mount Tabor represents the mountain of worship. Here at the Mass, we rise into the very presence of God, as we journey on pilgrimage with the priest to where Christ is on Mount Calvary at the altar. In all our lives, we need the "mountain of worship" in the Mass to sustain us in the valley of our day-to-day life and work. All of us need to move back and forth between the mountain and the valley. It's like breathing. On the mountain of worship, the Mass, we inhale the power, grace, and truth of Christ. We are reminded that we are creatures and instruments of God, and our life comes from and will someday return to God. We offer our whole lives to him in this moment. In the valley of our daily life, we exhale the life and spirit of Christ to those with whom we live and work. On the mountain, at the source and summit, we draw in spiritual life and vitality. In the valley, we breathe out that life into all we do and to those around us.

There is always a tendency to emphasize one over the other. There is the desire of Peter to stay on the mountain and leave the problems of life and the world behind. We all have had spiritual highs in life, and for some people, their faith is exclusively that, or implicitly perceived that way -a mere escape from the reality of their lives. But then there is the valley where we all live and work and navigate our struggles. Many in society today have opted to take no time for the mountain and live a life desperately in need of the mountain's grace, spiritual power, and moral clarity, but don't even know what they're missing. Without the mountain of regular worship in the Mass, we lack spiritual resources and become spiritually impotent, easily burned out and depleted without a moral compass. Without the valley, we end up with a religion of escape or private religious experience that has no bearing on reality. We all need the mountain, and we all need the valley.

As we speak about our pilgrimage to the mountain of worship which is the Mass and consider those whom we want to bring back to the Church, the Jubilee Year this year is a great opportunity. The purpose of a Jubilee Year, usually observed in the Church every 25 years, is to encourage people to make a pilgrimage, either to Rome or to a specially designated church in our own diocese, and to repent of one's sins and forgive the sins of others, and to renew one's spiritual life. # THIS &THAT FROM SR. YVONNE

"SPIRITUAL HIGHS" | Have you ever had an experience where you felt really close to God and to others who were sharing the same experience with you? You may even have wished that the experience would never end. In the Gospel of Luke 9:28-36, we see Peter, James and John along with Jesus on the mountaintop. These apostles saw Jesus in his glory talking with Moses and Elijah. Peter wanted to stay on the mountaintop and build three tents, one for Jesus, one for Moses, and one for Elijah, but that was not to be. Faith has its high moments as well as its low moments. It is unrealistic to think that we can maintain some kind of spiritual high all of the time. The faith of those who only depend on mountaintop experiences often fizzles out. We have to learn what it means to live as a Christian down in the thick of life. Our faith is more than feelings. God's love and mercy do not depend on our ability to feel "warm fuzzies" even though it might be nice to feel that way. In a rare moment, when we are discouraged, we might deeply encounter the Lord in prayer, or we may meet a kind and understanding person who meets us with kindness, understanding and love. Such moments can keep us going for a long time and can help us light up the lives of others. Before Jesus set out on his way to his sufferings and death, a glimpse of his resurrection and glory shone in him, to strengthen him, and to encourage the disciples for what was to come. This yearly glimpse of glory in the story of the Transfiguration tells us again that God recognizes our need for signs and support on our journey of faith. Recall a special time in your life when you felt on top of the world. How was God present in that experience? What was God inviting you to do after it was over? Did you do it? When we come to Mass, we have an assurance and a preview of what is ahead, especially in Communion. Jesus changes bread and wine into his own body and blood. We are reminded of how Jesus died for us. In Communion he wants us to be more closely united with himself. Someday we will enjoy perfect union with Jesus. When we come to that stage, like the three apostles at the Transfiguration, we won't ever want to leave and we won't have to because we will feel as the apostles did when they said "Lord, it is good for us to be here." We will have made it!! As we turn to Jesus in our Lenten prayers and sacrifices, let's remember that the Lord is here to lighten our way as we pray, listen and share with others. Happy second week of Lent! Have a Blessed week and stay well. Let us continue to pray for our sick, especially for Pope Francis and the sick from our community.




