St. John of God

Feast Day: March 8

John's early life was less than exemplary. At forty years of age, feeling remorse for his wild life, he resolved to devote himself to the ransom of the Christian slaves in Africa. On his return to Spain he sought to do good by selling holy pictures and books at low prices. At Granada a sermon by the celebrated John of Avila shook his soul to its depths. He began to collect homeless poor, and to support them by his work and by begging. The bishop became the Saint's patron and gave him the name of John of God. When his hospital was on fire, John was seen rushing about uninjured amidst the flames until he had rescued all his poor. After ten years spent in the service of the suffering, he died in 1550 at the age of fifty-five from an illness brought on by an attempt to save a drowning boy.

From Fr. Jesse Burish



Praised be Jesus Christ!

Originally, Lent was a period that led to baptism being administered; the period, therefore, in which people became Christians. It was thought that this would be accomplished not in a short moment of time, but only over the course of a journey of transformation and conversion that the person made step by step. Later, as the whole Church began to observe

this journey, it reflected the sense that this process of conversion is never a "one and done" deal, but rather that it is a lifelong journey on which we must set out repeatedly. The purpose of Lent, therefore, is to keep alive for us the fact that being a Christian disciple really means constantly striving to become a Christian ever anew; of growing in one's discipleship of Christ. It's not a "one and done," but a process of constant practice. For this season of Lent, I'd like us to consider that theme of becoming a disciple of Christ anew. I'll be drawing from our Sunday readings to answer the question each Sunday, "How am I being called to become a disciple of Christ anew?" This is essentially to renew the promise of my baptism. How am I being called to ever greater conversion and transformation?

On the first Sunday of Lent, while each year coming from a different Gospel writer, we always hear an account of Jesus being led into the desert for forty days and being tempted by the Devil. It's this event that essentially kicks off his whole ministry as the Messiah. A period of forty is significant in the Scriptures. The rains of the great flood with Noah in the ark last for 40 days and 40 nights. Israel journeyed in the desert for 40 years. Elijah walked for 40 days to Horeb, the mountain of God. Jesus fasted for 40 days. What is the point of this series of forties?

In the later period of Israel's history, people looked back to the 40 years of wandering in the desert as the time of first love between God and Israel, a time in which God revealed himself in profound and dramatic ways. God stood face to face with his people, spoke to them, and gave them instructions for their journey. In hindsight, it was like the honeymoon period after their deliverance from Egypt.

Of course, when we read the Old Testament more closely, it doesn't all exactly look or feel like a honeymoon period. Wandering out in the desert was also a time of great danger and temptation; a time when Israel complained against God, was dissatisfied with him, and wanted to return to paganism. It was a time in which they traveled in circles and fashioned other gods for themselves because God seemed to at the same time keep his distance from them.

Isn'tthissomewhat parallel to Jesus' experience in the desert described in our Gospel? After his baptism, he accepts his role as Messiah and suffering servant and goes into the desert, and at the same time being in the immediate presence of his Father, preparing himself to give of himself fully for his people. Does this pattern, this seemingly conflicting interpretation of the same event, sound at all familiar? If we are reflective enough about our own lives, this scriptural theme should describe our own life situations as well. How has your life been in the desert in the past, and how is it in the desert now? Might you be able to say that those times of greatest trial and temptation, of greatest danger, in which God seemed distant, may have been the times in which he was closest, in which God worked most dramatically, and in which you grew the most as his son or daughter? This kind of encounter with God happens most often when we are left with only the desert around us and sky above us, when we have no other worldly refuge, when there is nothing around of which to make a false god, but we only know emptiness and the unknown.

These forty days of Lent are a great time for us to become a disciple of Christ anew by embracing our deserts and seeing the way God's grace is at work in them (the honeymoon period within them, if you will). This is a time to examine anew how much I am really striving to grow as a disciple of Christ. Have I truly made him first or the center of my life? Have I made a commitment to better integrate the four elements of living as an intentional disciple: regular and consistent daily prayer, regular (perhaps monthly) confession and regular Mass attendance, building good Catholic relationships and friendships, especially in our parishes, and being intentional about trying to learn the Faith better through reading or listening to Catholic resources. All these things provide us with the tools of navigating the desert experiences (and the honeymoons) of our life. These are the practices we want to invite and encourage others in who have been away from the Church as we look toward the conclusion of the Eucharistic Revival this summer and enter this Jubilee Year of Hope.

~ Lenten Regulations ~

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, Mar. 5. The Lenten regulations are as follows:

- Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.
- In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

THIS &THAT FROM SR. YVONNE

"TURNING POINTS" | In Luke's Gospel 4:1-13, the story of Jesus' temptation in the desert appears just after Jesus' baptism and before Jesus begins his public ministry. We can imagine this as a time of transition, a turning point in Jesus' life. Perhaps we can liken it to one of the important turning points in our own lives. The decision to marry or to follow the Lord as a priest or sister, accept a new job, make the decision to move, etc. All of these decisions are challenges for us. After the moment of decision, having reached the point of no return, we sometimes begin to wonder if we are prepared and ready for the task ahead of us. Turning points can become times of doubt and insecurity. Jesus' response to the temptations of the devil offers us an example for responding in faith when our doubt and insecurities tempt us to distrust that God can/will help us. When tempted Jesus rebukes the devil by quoting Scripture, showing his trust in God. Our Lenten practices of prayer, fasting and alms give us invite to trust in God in small ways. They remind us that God is enough for us, and they prepare us to trust God in all things, especially in moments of doubt and uncertainty. Jesus' first temptation was to use his power for his own benefit: "turn these stones into bread." Jesus must have been hungry from his time in the desert, but he did not give into the temptation .saying: "One does not live on bread alone" Next the devil told Jesus that all the earthly kingdom belonged to him, and he would turn it over to Jesus if Jesus would worship him. This promise is from the devil, the father of lies. Jesus responded that it was written, "You shall worship the Lord, your God, and Him alone shall you serve." Now Jesus is at the top of the temple and the devil told him to jump and that nothing would happen to him if he really was the Son of God. It would be easy for Jesus to get a following if he would do something so radical. But Jesus tells him that "you shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test." Yah Jesus! Everyone is tested by temptation at some time. We may be tempted the most right after we make a decision to be a better person and to love and serve God more faithfully. Temptations don't always come from the devil. The world and the flesh provide temptations in our lives, too. No one is so holy that they will never be tempted. One temptation I face is to not be reflective about the use of my time, not spending enough time on important things. I am tempted to watch more TV or be on the computer too long. A little more prayer and less time with our electronics might be good for all of us. We all can do something special for Lent during these forty days that prepares us for the feast of Easter. Pope Francis gave us an invitation to "pause in the presence of God." Use the free Lenten booklets that are provided at each church to help you grow spiritually and as a result have a closer walk with the Lord, as the special song suggests. We pray that all of our turning points may bring us closer to the Lord and each other. Have a great Lent!





