#### St. Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274) January 28

St. Thomas Aquinas surpassed all his fellow students in learning and virtue. He entered the Order of St. Dominic against his parents' wishes and persevered in his vocation. He studied under St. Albert the Great and at age 22 began teaching and publishing his first works. He was nicknamed the "dumb ox" because of his silent ways and huge size, but he was really a brilliant student. He wrote and preached often and was one of the greatest influential theologians of all time. St Thomas was canonized in 1323 and declared Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius V. He is the patron of universities and students.

#### From Fr. Jesse Burish



Praise be Jesus Christ!

This Sunday we observe a special annual feast established by Pope Francis on September 30, 2019, the Sunday of the Word of God. While I've not given homiletic attention to this observance in the past, it seems particularly apropos for this Sunday's readings. Pope Francis' intention for establishing this Sunday of the Word of God was to accentuate the

importance that Sacred Scripture is meant to have in the faith, prayer, and lives of all of us as disciples. In establishing this special observance, Pope Francis expressed a hope that St. Jerome's example of converted zeal will be contagious, that each of us will "grow in religious and intimate familiarity with the sacred Scriptures" and "grow in love and faithful witness." Pope Francis is essentially saying that our more serious engagement with the Scriptures would make us more intentional disciples and missionary disciples and help us "bring one back."

We have in this Sunday's first reading an incredibly rich commentary on how we're supposed to receive, respond to, and rejoice in the Word of God. The setting was after God's Chosen People had been exiled to Babylon, which lasted about 70 years, and returned to Jerusalem. Rummaging through the ruins of the Temple, they found the Book of the Law of Moses, what Jews would call the Torah, the first five books of our Old Testament. They rediscovered with incredible joy and gratitude God's holy Word.

Ezra the scribe brought the book of the Law before the men, women, and children old enough to understand and proceeded to read from the Torah from dawn to midday—about six or seven hours—and "all the people listened attentively." In this scene, we find four things that should characterize our response to Christ's word as we hear it together:

The first response is *listening* to what we read or hear. Nehemiah tells us, "All the people listened attentively to the book of the law." To listen to the Word of God is to listen to it as a word to be done, as an imperative once understood. We're called to say like Mary, "Let it be done to me according to your Word." It is listening in order to act.

The second response is *converting*. Nehemiah says to the people, "Do not be sad, and do not weep," because the people were weeping as they heard the word and realized they had not been faithful to it. Likewise, the Word of God is meant to bring us to conversion, to change our lives, so that we conform ourselves to what God is telling us, rather than the world. Do we listen to God's Word truly expecting to be challenged and changed? The third response is *acts of charity*. The first reading says that "all the people raised their hands high, saying, 'Amen. Amen'" and immediately began to allot portions of food and drink to those who didn't have any "because they understood the words that had been expounded to them." The conversion God's Word brings about is meant to help us love God with all our mind, heart, soul, and strength, and love our neighbor.

The fourth and last response is *celebrating*. In our first reading, there was a great feast. "Go, eat rich foods and drink sweet drinks," they were told, "for today is holy to our Lord. Do not be saddened this day, for rejoicing in the Lord must be your strength!" The Word of God is meant to give us true joy, and this flows from the total transformation the Word of God does in us.

The Word of God is powerful and active. May we renew our hearing, reading, studying, and praying over God's Word today with real conviction of its power in our life resulting in deeper conversion, growth in charity, and joy in our hearts.

## THIS &THAT FROM SR. YVONNE

#### "JESUS SETS US FREE"

What would you like to be set free from right now? In the gospel today, Jesus told the townsfolk in the Nazareth synagogue as he read from the prophet's scroll that he had been sent "to proclaim liberty to captives" and "to let the oppressed go free." Jesus, as our teacher, had in mind not freedom from the Roman oppressors, but rather he came to set us free from sin and death itself, and from everything that prevents us from living the abundant life he came to give us. Do you worry too much? Are you afraid and fear keeps you awake at night or stops you from moving forward in your spiritual life? Are you discouraged about the state of the world, or the state of your family, or maybe you are trying to get rid of some bad habit that leads you into sin? Jesus died and rose so that we could be set free from anything that steals our peace and joy. The daily news leaves us with many situations, whether environmental, political, or international, that make us feel frightened, angry, or cynical. Sometimes the newscasters highlight the worst things. We watch and they make money. We keep tuning in. Sometimes we just need to take a break from the news and know that Jesus is in charge. This year, the Church invites us to make a pilgrimage of hope. How do we become heralds of hope who try to bring light into every dark corner of our society? Jesus declared himself anointed to bring good news to the poor, freedom to the captives, and a new vision for all. Jesus announced Jubilee itself to be "a year acceptable to the Lord." The most helpful thing we can do is to refrain from negative ideas. We may have to avoid news outlets that stir up negative emotions. Or we might have to fast from podcasts, music, print media, and all the stuff we read on our phones. We communicate our values, beliefs, and hopes in every exchange with other people.

**A Jubilee Prayer:** May the grace of the Jubilee reawaken in us, Pilgrims of Hope, a yearning for the treasures of heaven. May the same grace spread the joy and peace of our Redeemer throughout the earth. To you our God, eternally blessed, be glory and praise forever, Amen. Jesus, thank you for setting us free! Have a blessed week!





