St. Peter Canisius (May 8, 1521-Dec. 21, 1597) Feast Day: December 21

Peter Canisius, S.J. was born in Nijmegen in the Duchy of Guelders, which is now the Netherlands. He earned a Master's degree in 1540, at the age of 19. St. Canisius became the first Dutchman to join the newly-founded Society of Jesus in 1543. He was an influential teacher and preacher, especially through his "German Catechism", a book which defined the basic principles of Catholicism in the German language. The restoration of the Catholic Church in Germany after the Protestant Reformation is largely attributed to the work there of the Society of Jesus, which he led.

From Fr. Jesse Burish



Praised be Jesus Christ!

This Sunday is "Gaudete" Sunday, from the Latin *gaudete*, "rejoice," which traditionally begins the entrance antiphon for the Mass, taken from St. Paul's letter to the Philippians 4:4. Many parishes, including our own mark this Sunday with rose-colored (*not pink!*) vestments, and the theme of joy runs through the readings. This Sunday marks the

liturgical halfway point of Advent, and the Church rejoices because Christ's coming is near. The Lord is, of course, always near to us, but in Advent we undergo a liturgical-spiritual exercise of living through the expectation of his arrival much like ancient Israel in the Old Testament awaited the fulfillment of God's promises to them.

St. Paul's exhortation to "rejoice always," admittedly seems a little strange or hollow. If he was to say, "Rejoice when things are going well," or "Rejoice when you're having a good day," we could understand that. But how can you rejoice when you've just had a bitter disappointment, or when you've gotten bad news from your doctor, or when someone else just got the job you've always wanted?

We all face so many challenges on a personal and public level. There are financial stresses, health problems, deadlines at work, and dysfunctional relationships with family members. On a broader societal level, there are horrible wars being fought, political gridlock, and an ongoing fight to preserve and build up marriage and family life in an aggressively secular culture. In the Church there are scandals and episodes of doctrinal confusion. And yet, St. Paul is using the imperative form of the verb here: he is commanding us to be joyful! Amid all this, how do we rejoice?

It's healthy to remind ourselves that the good news is not that Jesus came to give us an upper-class lifestyle with a three-stall garage, three kids, and a big house in the country. There is no such promise in the New Testament. Instead, one finds expressions like, "If any man would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me" (Luke (9:23). Or "Blessed are those who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Matt 5:10). Or "In this world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world" (John 16:33).

We need to keep reminding ourselves that the good news is not a plan for temporal comfort in this life because it is our tendency to revert to thinking that it is. And when we look around and see that things are not comfortable, even after two thousand years, we mistakenly think the good news has not worked.

The good news is about eternal life with God through Jesus Christ, which starts now but won't be directly seen until the life in the world to come. The good news really is about heaven and what lies beyond the grave. Even if Jesus were to give everyone who believes in him total economic and political stability for the duration of their temporal lives, it would not satisfy the longing of the human heart, which is made for so much more.

The joy or rejoicing we're talking about here is not that of mere emotions based on changing circumstances in life, but rather a peace that comes from being grounded in the eternal reality of God. From that place, I can watch the ups and downs of life and still be rooted in the peace that comes from God and anticipate the fulfillment of that peace in eternal life. This is how it is possible to rejoice in every circumstance. We're not being told to have positive feelings but rather to reorient our lives on Christ and eternity.

What enabled St. Teresa Calcutta to maintain a spiritual joy while working in one of the worst slums in the world? What enabled St. Thomas More to make jokes with his executioner? What enabled any of the martyrs in the Church's history to act with such courage and heroism? Each of them had found their life in Christ and looked forward to its fulfillment in eternity. They responded to the command to rejoice always.



THIS & THAT FROM SR. YVONNE

"REJOICE, THE LORD IS NEAR!" | This Sunday is often called Gaudete or Rejoice Sunday. It is our annual reminder that joy and laughter befit us as Christians, much more than sadness and gloom. If someone asked you what there is to be joyful about in the world in which we live, what would you say? Although Christmas is still ten days away, we can begin rejoicing in Jesus' birth now. We can also look forward to Jesus' Second Coming, when he will establish a new heaven and a new earth. We don't know when this will happen, but we are called to rejoice in it. Why? Because our God always keeps his promises. We may be going through a difficult time this Advent, so we may not feel like rejoicing. However, it is possible to rejoice on what has been promised to us. In the second reading today, St. Paul advises us to "rejoice in the Lord always." We can rejoice that the Lord loves us so much he became man to save us. We can rejoice that Jesus in the Eucharist wants us to be with him in the closest way possible. So let us choose to rejoice today, no matter how we may feel. When the people ask John the Baptist what they are supposed to do, John suggests simple things. He asks the people to share food and clothing with those who are in need. He tells tax collectors to be fair in their responsibilities. He advises soldiers not to use their power to bully others. John the Baptist did not tell the people to wait for the Messiah, but to prepare for the Messiah through acts of repentance. It is a busy time of preparation, but our challenge is to not let this be a frenzied time, but rather a time of joyful anticipation of making ready for God who comes to dwell among us. People should know we are Christians, not by bumper stickers or lawn signs, but by the kindness with which we treat one another, including total strangers. We mark this Sunday by lighting a rose-colored candle instead of a purple one on our Advent wreath. It is a reminder that the Advent season is a season of joy because our salvation is already at hand, and we are halfway to Christmas. Joy is a choice. This Advent, let our prayer be one of thanksgiving that the Lord is here amongst us. Let us ask for the grace to keep us from worrying about the future and to give us joy and help to do the task that we have been assigned to in life and to spread happiness as we wait in joyful hope for the coming of Jesus. One of my favorite Advent songs is: "Proclaim The Joyful Message, That Our God is Coming to Earth" What is your favorite Advent hymn? Let us pray for each other as we spend these days of Advent getting ready for the celebration of Christmas. REJOICE, THE LORD IS NEAR!


