St. Francis de Sales (1567-1622)

Feast Day: January 24

Francis was a patient man. He knew for thirteen years that he had a vocation to the priesthood before he mentioned it to his family. He never wanted to push his wishes on God. He studied law in Padua and Paris and then God finally made His will clear to Francis. While he was riding, Francis fell from his horse three times. Every time he fell, the sword and scabbard came to rest on the ground in the shape of the cross. Francis became a priest and dedicated himself to preaching and to the spiritual formation of the faithful with great success. He taught that the call to holiness was for everyone. He wrote *Introduction to the Devout Life*, a classic of spiritual direction. He was canonized in 1665. In 1877, Pius IX proclaimed him Doctor of the Church. Pius XI declared him patron of journalists and other writers.



From Fr. Jesse Burish



Praised be Jesus Christ!

This Sunday continues with the theme of "epiphany" which began two weeks ago when we heard the Gospel account of the Magi traveling from the East to see the infant Jesus. This was followed last Sunday by the Gospel account of Christ's baptism in the Jordan by John the Baptist and his being revealed as the beloved Son of the Father. Now this Sunday

we hear the Wedding Feast at Cana in which Christ's divinity is revealed through his first miracle in John's Gospel of turning water into wine. Each of the events recounted in the Gospel over the last few Sundays are a sort of "epiphany" in that they manifest God's glory and who Christ is as the one sent by God.

The readings for this Sunday, particularly, highlight Jesus as our "spiritual bridegroom." To fully appreciate the full import of this title for Jesus, and to fully appreciate the message that the scriptures are conveying, we need to point out the heavy use of marriage imagery that is not only used in our readings this Sunday but is also found in many places throughout the Bible. In Israelite culture, marriage was seen as a covenant, a sacred bond between two people. For this reason, the Old Testament writers use marriage as an image of the covenant relationship between the Lord God and Israel, and Jesus uses it as an image of the covenant relationship between himself and the Church he establishes, which is the new Israel.

In our Gospel recounting the Wedding at Cana, Jesus reveals himself as the "ultimate Bridegroom." The responsibility of the bridegroom at ancient weddings was to provide the wine. We can see that in this passage when the headwaiter tastes the wine, he immediately calls the bridegroom, assuming that he was the one responsible for obtaining what Jesus miraculously provided. By this miracle, Jesus shows that he is the Bridegroom with whom no mere mortal can compete, the Bridegroom of the Church, our own spiritual spouse. Baptism is the nuptial bath, the Eucharist is the wedding feast, where we receive the Body of our Bridegroom and unite his body with ours. Our faith is one of intense intimacy. God loves us like a bride. He "rejoices" in us, takes delight in us, each one of us individually.

Of course, many people who have wandered away from the Faith or the Church have failed to see any of this. For many, the Mass in which one receives Jesus the Bridegroom in the Eucharist lacks any substantive meaning for them. The way in which this marriage-like intimacy is known and experienced in our Christian lives is through a life of intentional discipleship: regular and consistent prayer, full engagement in the sacraments, being in relationship with others striving for intimacy with Christ, and actively striving to know the Scriptures and the Church better.

Having spoken about how God's glory has been manifested in Christ, our spiritual Bridegroom, at the Wedding at Cana, I'd like to conclude by saying how God's glory is manifested in each of us as members of Christ's Bride, the Church. The second reading from St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians speaks about how "to each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit." St. Paul lists all these spiritual gifts, or what we call "charisms" – knowledge, faith, healing, mighty deeds, prophesy, discernment of spirits, varieties and interpretation of tongues – spiritual gifts that God gives to all Christians as forms of service to the Church that manifest that God is at work among us.

The sad reality today is that most people in most parishes don't know that they all have certain spiritual gifts or charisms such as those listed by St. Paul because those spiritual gifts aren't fully activated or realized in a person unless one is living as an intentional disciple in the ways I mentioned earlier. Think about the people we want to bring back to the Church. Do they have any clue that they have latent within them special spiritual gifts for the buildup of the Church? Because we haven't fully embraced our call to discipleship and the spousal intimacy we are to have with Christ the Bridegroom, the Church is less, and our parishes are less potent in their mission.

May we today embrace more fully our call to discipleship by daily prayer, fuller reception of the sacraments, Catholic friendships, and learning better the Scriptures so that we can deepen our spousal relationship with the Lord, and more clearly manifest God's glory in the Church through our spiritual gifts.

THIS &THAT FROM SR. YVONNE

"DO WHATEVER HE TELLS YOU" | There are many layers of meaning in today's gospel. The sanctity of marriage is one of them. It is significant that it was at a wedding feast that Jesus worked his first miracle. In his thirty years of living at home, he saw lots of sick, crippled and blind people that would have appreciated being cured, but his first miracle wasn't one of healing. His first miracle was in response to a request from his mother. It was to keep a wedding celebration from a bad ending and embarrassment for the bride and groom. When the wedding hosts risk the embarrassment of running out of wine, Mary recognizes a need and gently pushes her son to do something. Jesus resists, saying that his hour has not come and he does not feel ready. Yet Mary sees what Jesus needs to do and she tells the servants to "Do whatever he tells you." These words are our instructions, too. Whatever we are facing, we are called to do what Jesus asks of us, according to the gifts the Spirit has given us. The people who ran out of wine at the wedding symbolize people who have run out of hope. They had prepared for everything to be plentiful; they were beginning a new life and then it started to fall apart as the joy wore thin. Mary noticed, and instead of arguing with Jesus, she told the stewards what to do. Jesus responded to his mother's urgings, not because he was ready, but because of the need and the urging of his mother. We have begun THE JUBILE YEAR OF HOPE. Pope Francis tells us that hope is both a gift and a duty. He says that hope is waiting for something that has already been given to us: salvation in God's eternal kingdom. As our world is today, we seem to be running out of joy. We are sorrowful with the victims of war, we are concerned about our country and world, we see the devastation of fire and bad storms. What will it be like for our descendants and for our children in the future? Mary didn't know what Jesus would do at the wedding feast, only that he could make a difference. We are invited to be pilgrims of hope and to make a difference. We have been given the gifts necessary. We only need to "Do whatever he tells us." We can do our best and God will do the rest. Today, Jesus works another miracle, changing bread and wine into his body and blood. This miracle of the Eucharist has only one purpose: to change us into the kind of loving person that Jesus calls us to be. So whatever situation we are in, whether single, married, widowed, separated or divorced, we all have to interact with people and to grow in and share our love. This week, we observe and pray especially for Christian Unity, and we remember and celebrate Martin Luther King, Jr. Day. We can turn Mary's words into a prayer for the whole Christian family. Each of us, according to our gifts and charisms, can contribute to God's ongoing work in the world. We can open a new bottle, share with a friend, and "Do whatever He tells us." Let us pray for each other, as well as for all married couples and those who are contemplating marriage. May we all have a blessed week!





