Feast Day: January 4

Convert to Roman Catholicism; foundress of the American Sisters of Charity; a wife, mother, widow, sole parent, foundress, educator, social minister, and spiritual leader; Elizabeth Bayley Seton (1774-1821) was the first person born in the United States to become a canonized saint (September 14, 1975). At the invitation of the archbishop, she established a Catholic girls' school in Baltimore, MD which initiated the parochial school system in America. To run the system she founded the Sisters of Charity in 1809, the first native American religious community for women.

From Fr. Jesse Burish



Praised be Jesus Christ

This Sunday's Gospel is one that is centered around religious action or ritual. St. Luke, our Gospel writer, says how the Holy Family of Mary and Joseph and the infant Jesus went to the Temple in Jerusalem for the ritual purification and presentation, all in accordance with the precepts of the Jewish Law of Moses. Jesus and the Holy Family did not shy away

from religious ritual. For those who like to assert that organized religion and religious ritual are bad or that it was something which Christ came to do away with, they should read the Gospels more closely. By humbling themselves in obedience and placing a priority on worship, and in this case, the structured worship within Judaism, the Holy Family put themselves in a position to receive beautiful blessings and insight from Simeon and Anna, who were waiting for them, as it were.

This fact should be insightful for us in our spiritual lives. God continues to wait for us in the place of worship. When we attend Mass and the other sacraments, particularly regularly going Confession, we encounter God who has been "waiting for us" to show up, ready with a blessing to bestow on us. This is by no means sentimental, because sufferings and struggles in our Christian life are going to come and we will share in Christ's Passion in one way or another. Nonetheless, God waits for us with the encouragement we need, if we show up and make our "holy appointments"—be that our weekly Mass obligations, our daily prayer time, our other commitments to growing in faith and fellowship, and the commitments of our vocation and state in life—with a spirit of obedience and humility.

The Feast of the Holy Family, particularly with this Sunday's readings, provides us an opportunity to renew our commitment to the Church's vision for traditional family rooted in marriage between one man and one woman, and that such a family be supported by bonds of community with extended family and/or a community of other families. Speaking about how faith and salvation passes by way of the family, and how the Holy Family models the importance of religious practice, I was reminded of an article I read last year entitled, "The Real Reason People Leave Religion." As we all know, with each new generation, fewer and fewer people claim any religious affiliation or practice any religion. The author of this article, Daniel Cox, states that while there is no single answer, "the most compelling explanation is that changes in American family life precipitated this national decline. American families have changed dramatically over the past few decades and many churches have been slow to respond. Americans raised in blended families, interfaith families, or single-parent families are far less likely to have participated in religion growing up. And these types of family arrangements have become far more common today than they once were." He cites another author who, in 2020, wrote of the disintegration of traditional family life that featured large, interconnected networks of extended family members-grandparents, in-laws, cousins, nieces, and nephews, and argued that because these family networks are no longer strong today, many cultural and religious values are no longer effectively transmitted. Cox concluded by stating that "there is no more powerful explanation for why Americans leave religion, or why they never take it up in the first place, than the family."

Both our Gospel and the article which I guoted point to why we as Catholics must continue holding up and holding onto the traditional Christian vision for family, and maintain networks of families, and seek to follow the example of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. For in a very real way, our relationship with God and our salvation is riding on the family.


The Chosen

"FOCUS ON THE FAMILY" | Here we are at the first Sunday after Christmas. The Catholic Church celebrates the feast of the Holy Family: Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The Bible does not tell us a lot about the Holy Family. We know that Joseph was a kind and compassionate man, eager to do God's will. He raised Jesus as his own son even though he was not Jesus' biological father. Jesus was raised by Mary and Joseph in a home with lots of love and faith. We can be sure the Holy Family had their moments of conflict and crisis, as all families do. Luke tells us in the Gospel today that Jesus gets separated from his parents, staying behind in the temple. Yes, they were worried until they went back to the temple and found Jesus there. Mary and Joseph didn't understand that their child, found in the temple, was not lost at all: he knew his vocation and had answered the call. Mary and Joseph's love for Jesus helped them to survive this conflict and they grew stronger because of it. To the Church, the Holy Family is a model of respect, compassion, love and faith in family life. If we can duplicate the love that Mary, Joseph and Jesus had for each other, there is no telling what the rich effects on our health, our wellbeing, and our overall happiness might be. We have to remember that family is not limited to those who share the same bloodline. There are possibilities for family everywhere: at church, at our workplace, or among those who share common interests with us. How does your family express love and respect for one another? What crises and conflicts have you and your family survived? What can you do now to bring the gualities of the Holy Family more fully into your family life? On the feast of the Holy Family, may we strive to be strong and healthy families, full of thankfulness and love for each other. You may not have the perfect family, but you can become a holy family as you grow "in wisdom and age and favor." There is much to be said for a close and loving family. As we head for the new year of 2025, let us be thankful for the blessings of family we experienced during this holy season.
